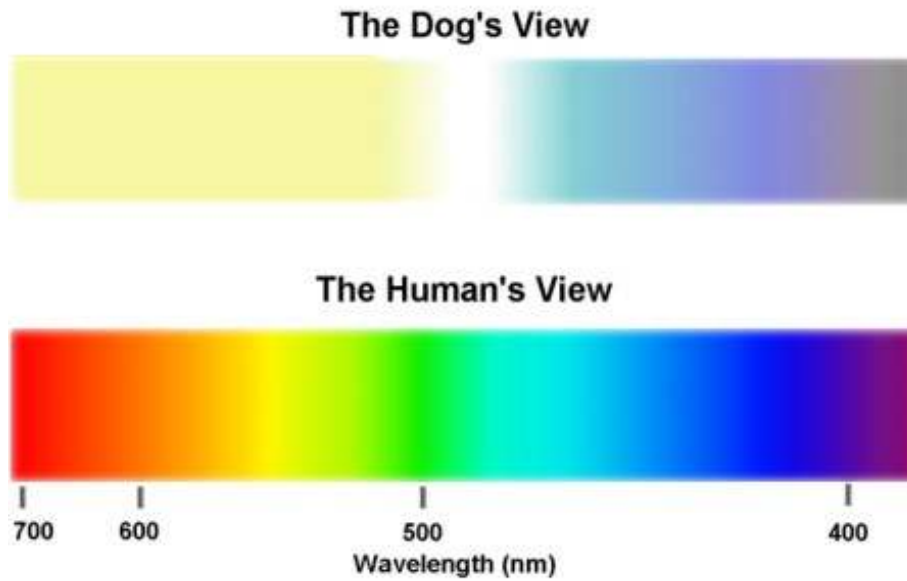


Because of the lower number of cone photoreceptors in a dog's eye, dogs are red-green colour blind. The greater number of rod photoreceptors allows them to see a brighter, but less colour-detailed world when compared to humans.
